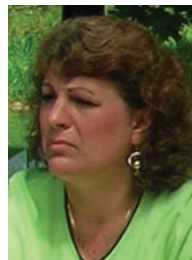

Directions to the Island & Ferry Service is fairly simple: for those traveling from point's south, follow I-75 north to Mackinac City. For those traveling from the north or west, follow I-75 south to St. Ignace. Watch for the well-marked exits to your boat dock of choice in either Mackinac City or St. Ignace. The Mackinac Bridge spans the Lower and Upper Peninsulas connecting the two communities and tolls are assessed for vehicles traveling over the Bridge. Tolls begin at approximately \$2.50 for passenger vehicles increasing according to size of your vehicle, truck, RV or bus. The Mackinac Bridge Authority accepts tokens or cash **only**. Scheduled ferryboat service is available throughout the day and ample parking is available on the mainland at all ferry docks. All ferries charge a \$20./per adult, round trip and \$10./per child. We hope to be able to provide all Registrants and Speakers with \$2. discount coupons for one or more of the ferry companies which will either be mailed to you by the Lake View Hotel or along with your Seminar Registration Confirmation. The ferry companies are Shepler's: 231 436 5023 (closest dock to the Lake View Hotel on the Island), Starr Lines: 231 436 5045, and Arnold Lines: 231 436 5542. Each line has its' own Ferry Schedule – you must contact them separately and request departure **AND** return times to and from the Island back to your car in either Mackinaw City or St. Ignace. Each also has a website with additional

information and schedules.

Thursday Night Dinner at the Grand Hotel will be a wonderful adventure you will remember for years to come. At approximately 5:45PM on Thursday evening, September 28th, horse drawn carriages will pick-up our group in front of the Lake View Hotel and take all to dinner at the Grand Hotel. Remember all Grand Hotel dinner guests must meet their **Hotel Dinner Dress Code Requirements**: men must wear suit coats and ties and women must wear either dressy dresses or dressy pantsuits. After dinner you may explore the magnificence of this historic landmark and return to the Lake View either with a leisurely walk or by carriage (\$4.25 fee).

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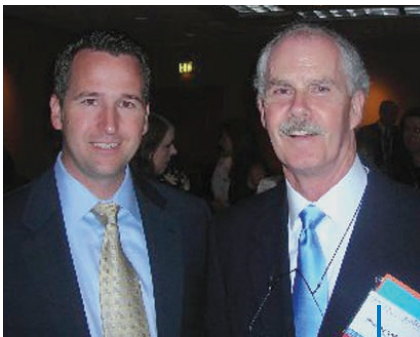

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Scheduling Expert Testimony

David Burgoyne, a Past President of Chapter 7, and a widely recognized instructor and expert witness, has suggested the following proposed changes to procedures regarding expert witnesses may be something to monitor:

The court may, in its discretion, craft a procedure for the presentation of all expert testimony to assist the jurors in performing their duties. Such procedures may include, but are not limited to:

- 1) Scheduling the presentation of the parties' expert witnesses sequentially; or
- 2) allowing the opposing experts to be present during the other's

testimony and to aid counsel in formulating questions to be asked of the testifying expert on cross-examination; or

- 3) providing for a panel discussion by all experts on a subject after or in lieu of testifying. The panel discussion, moderated by a neutral expert or the trial judge, would allow the experts to question each other.

Judge's Ruling Paves Way for Wolverine Pipeline

The \$45 million Wolverine pipeline can be built through Lansing, according to an Ingham County Circuit Court ruling.



Judge James Giddings ruled against the city, which had challenged the constitutionality of a new state law that strips control from communities when utilities try to build on state property within their boundaries.
