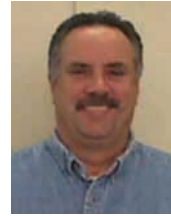
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## International Right of Way Association Michigan Chapter 7

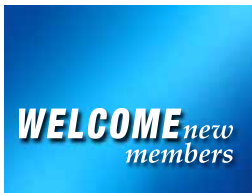

## Legislative Update

### Enrolled Senate Joint Resolution E

State Senator Stamas has introduced an amendment to the state constitution of 1963: Enrolled Senate Joint Resolution E. This resolution which, among other things, would:

- a) Require condemning agencies to pay 125% of fair market value for taking a private property owner's principal residence, in addition to any other reimbursement allowed by law. Compensation would be determined in a court of record.
- b) Define "public use" to exclude "taking a private property for transfer to a private entity for the purpose of economic development or enhancement of tax revenues."

## Pipeline Committee Notes

### City Fights Pipeline/New Law in Court

Ingham County Circuit Judge James Giddings heard arguments Friday involving Wolverine Pipeline Company's controversial plan to build a \$45M gasoline pipeline through South Lansing. The City is challenging the constitutionality of a new state law which lets the state approve utility construction on state property without local government weigh-in. It is not clear when Giddings will rule. All five townships on the proposed route have OK'd the project, with Lansing the lone holdout.

## New Michigan Law Protects Facilities

A new Michigan Law (Public Act 304 and 305 coming from Senate Bill 686 and 685) makes it a felony to trespass on a key facility in Michigan. Key facilities are defined to include a refinery, a petroleum storage terminal, and a "transportation facility" and seems to include pipeline pump/metering stations as long as the facilities are enclosed within a fenced area. These key facilities must have posted signs forbidding entry. The bill was signed into law on December 20, 2005 and goes into effect on April 15, 2006. Any person who violates this law is guilty of a felony, punishable by imprisonment for not more than 4 years or a fine of not more than \$2,500.00 or both.

## Web Post Urges Jihadists to Attack Alaska Pipeline

A recent posting on a Web site purportedly affiliated with al-Quida urges attacks against the trans-Alaska oil pipeline and Valdez tanker dock, calling on jihadists to either shower the pipe with bullets or hide and detonate explosives along its length.

The 10-page posting includes numerous links to Web sites providing maps and other basic information about the pipeline. Spokesmen for the FBI and other law enforcement and security agencies said they were aware of the posting, but none would comment on whether it prompted any extra security measures in Alaska.

It is no secret that the terminal at Valdez and the trans-Alaska pipeline are critical assets to not only the state but the country. The pipeline plays a critical role in this nation's economy. It carries more than 800,000 barrels of crude a day, roughly one-eighth of U.S. production.
