At this meeting we will have the opportunity to take the Ford Rouge Plant Tour and have a Ford Motor Company presenter on Brownfield Redevelopment. Solar savings, land restoration and water treatment are all part of this incredible complex environmental program.

At its peak of operations the Ford Rouge complex was a mile and a half wide and more than a mile long and there were over 100,000 employees on site, including 5,000 maintenance workers alone. The plant operated with a manufacturing concept called *vertical integration*. Today the Rouge complex is measured in acres, there are only about 6,000 employees, and their operating principles are known as *organic integration*.

This program is an important feature in learning how Brownfield redevelopment is conducted and the benefits that result.

Attorneys, appraisers, land acquisition personnel, surveyors and all those involved in valuation and acquisition will benefit from attending this program.

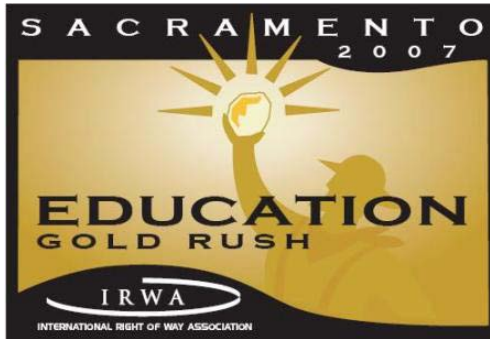

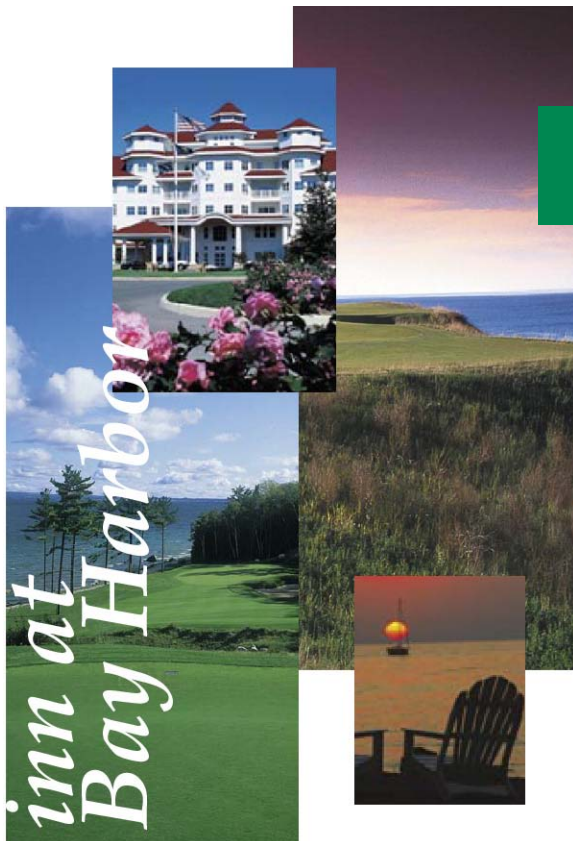
