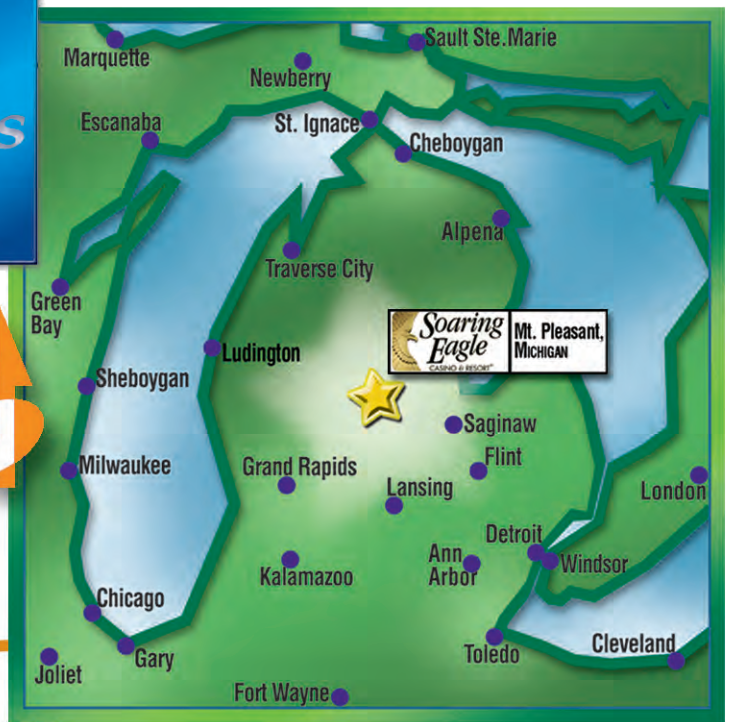

### Wolverine Pipeline

According to a story in the Lansing State Journal on March 12, the MI Supreme Court has declined to hear the appeal of the Wolverine Pipeline Case. The City of Lansing had appealed a Court of Appeals ruling which upheld the constitutionality

of legislation which did not require utilities to obtain permission from local governments on pipeline and other projects. The ruling appears to remove the last obstacle for Wolverine Pipeline to construct. However, with current price levels for petroleum products and a slow economy, Wolverine has not decided whether to move forward.

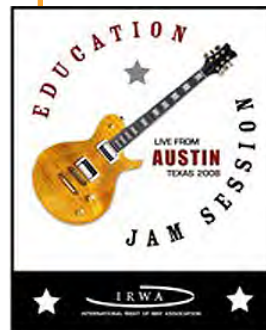

### Consultant of the Year Award

At the 2008 MI Airport Conference, held jointly by the MI Association of Airport Executives (MAAE) and MI Department of Transportation – Aeronautics (AERO), **Commonwealth Associates, Inc. (CAI)** was awarded AERO's 2007 Consultant of the Year Award. The award
