At the IRWA International Board of Director's Meeting held in Austin, Texas, Patricia A. Michigan Supreme Court Upholds Constitutionality

The Michigan Supreme Court finally issued its decision in the case of Michigan Department of Transportation vs. Rodney Tomkins and Darcy Tomkins on June 11, 2008 (Michigan Supreme Court decision docket No. 132983). The Tomkins decision involved a partial taking of the Defendant's property in connection with constructing the M-6 highway. MDOT had undertaken a partial taking of the defendant's property for the M-6 Project. MDOT was constructing several bridge overpasses to accommodate existing roads such as Kenowa Avenue, upon which the Defendant's two (2) acre parcel was fronting. MDOT had filed a condemnation action, seeking to acquire a portion of the Defendant's property, to construct the elevated overpass at Kenowa.

The property owner's rejected the offer of compensation of \$4,200.00. Besides arguing over the fair market value of the property, the defendant's sought additional damages of \$48,200.00, based on damages that the defendant's appraiser had attributed to "dust, dirt, noise, vibration and smell" of nearby M-6.

In its concluding discussion, the majority reiterated that the pre 1963 case law did not provide any clear indication that just compensation was intended to include the "general effects of the project" damages in a partial taking context. Therefore, it held that MCL 213.70(2) is constitutional. The majority also telegraphed to the Legislature, to decide if it desires that property owners in a partial taking condemnation be compensated for the "general effects of the project" damages' that is a decision that the Legislature can make by enlarging by statute the scope of what is intended to be covered by the term "just compensation."

Therefore, unless and until Legislature, acts to further define just compensation as including the general effects of a project as being within the scope of compensable damages under the definition of "just compensation," such claims made by property owners are not compensable and are deemed to be damnun absque injuria, thus there is no recovery for these claims and they must be excluded in a partial taking case.
