Michigan Foreclosures – November 2008

Although foreclosures in Michigan have dropped to 7th place v. 3rd from last year, the total number of foreclosures have risen dramatically. Detroit, unfortunately, is among the 20 hardest hit metropolitan areas. According to a recent seminar at the State Bar of Michigan Real Property Section program on the subject, Comerica Bank's attorney shared that foreclosure notices to homeowners have increased 70% from Q3 2007 to Q3 2008. This is very tough news for a state also reeling from the weakness of the auto industry and instability on the energy front.

Good advice for people faced with possible foreclosure is to call their lender's loss mitigation department as soon as possible to work out possible alternate solutions. You won't be surprised to know that lenders do not want to take back houses, even more now than ever. Lenders are moving their staff from loan origination to loss mitigation. Also HUD and MSHDA (Save the Dream) have been funding and training foreclosure counselors for the past year or two. The laws on the state and federal front have been changing rapidly and these counselors are in a good position to apply updated help to individual circumstances. These services range from free to nominal. United Way started their own hotline by dialing 211... or 800 552 1183. Because the social, stabilizing fabric of a neighborhood is at high risk with foreclosures, the longer term effects are much more devastating to larger communities and cities. Perhaps we could help to mitigate some of the damage by sharing this information with others... if you aren't already!
