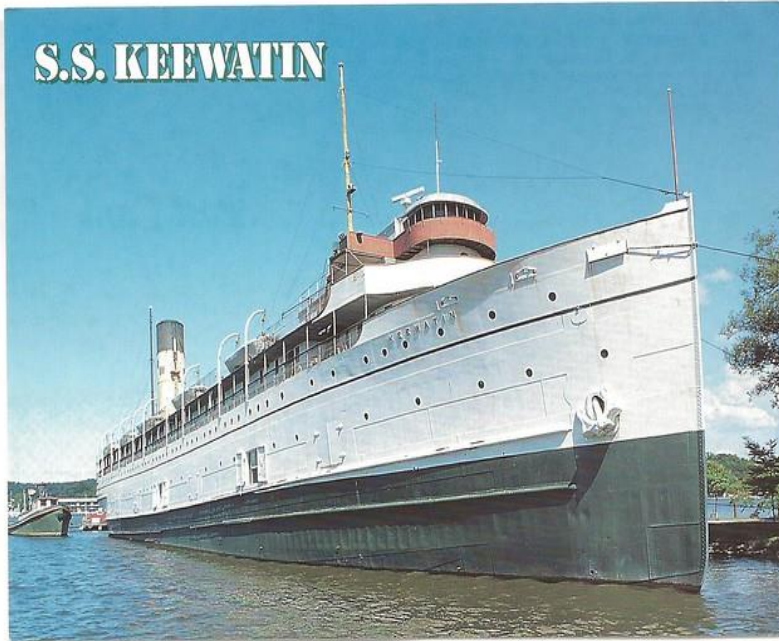
Phil Norder, PS | Land Survey Manager – Consumers Energy

Did you see the news? A few weeks ago, the beloved S.S. Keewatin made its final voyage past the Cities of Port Huron and Detroit as it traveled to its final resting place for restoration and display.

The S.S. Keewatin is one of the largest and last remaining Edwardian-era passenger steamers in existence today. The vessel was built in 1907 by the Fairfield Shipbuilding & Engineering Co Ltd. in Glasgow, Scotland. For perspective, the famed RMS Titanic was constructed later in 1909.

The ship will undergo many necessary repairs in the Spring and Summer of 2023. It will then be integrated into the Marine Museum of the Great Lakes to forever memorialize this important piece of Great Lakes and transportation history.

End of an era: Removal efforts were recently completed for the Pere Marquette Railroad Bridge in Port Huron. For locals, the city skyline has undoubtedly been changed forever.

Originally completed in 1931, the bridge provided rail access north of the Black River for decades before being abandoned in 1975.

The Army Corp of Engineers issued a permit to the Port Huron Yacht Club to remove the rail bridge in 2020. It was labeled as a safety risk and liability. Supposedly, the original rail operator planned to dismantle the bridge 50 years ago, but never did. A small portion of the bridge remains and will be memorialized by the community.
